

<u>Update from the International College of Laboratory Animal Medicine</u> <u>January 2021</u>

Dear friends,

As you may remember, we asked you to participate in helping the International Association of Laboratory Animal Medicine set priorities for our strategic plan to guide us through the next four years. One of goals of our new strategic plan is to improve our communication with our stakeholders and organizations sharing common interests.

Over the last couple of years, under the leadership of IACLAM President Dr. Hilton Klein, major initiatives and accomplishments included:

- Two developing Colleges of laboratory animal medicine (India and the Philippines) were invited to participate in IACLAM business as observer organizations in 2019. We are pleased to welcome the Indian College of Laboratory Animal Medicine (ICLAM) as a full member College, effective December 2020
- IACLAM's Training Task Force worked with Member Colleges to ensure that each College had a document describing the expected competencies of a newly board-certified laboratory animal veterinary specialist, and that the expected knowledge and skills required were harmonized across the Colleges.
- Together with AAALAC International and the World Veterinary Association (WVA), sponsored a memorandum of understanding to allow the WVA and AAALAC International to work jointly
- Developed a strategic plan based on the stakeholder survey. This strategic plan was adopted in November 2020 and is provided as an attachement to this document.
- Elected new IACLAM Board of Director offices, with effect November 1, 2020. See the attached news release.
- The task force convened by IACLAM, and supported by IACLAM, to examine evidence for adverse welfare
 indicators in laboratory rats and mice undergoing CO₂ euthanasia published Welfare Impact of Carbon Dioxide
 Euthanasia on Laboratory Mice and Rats: A Systematic Review
